



As of the first of June, with our new pastor in place, our estimated monthly income (including fundraisers) should roughly equal our estimated expenses. These estimates are from the fall of 2016 when we were preparing our 2017 budget. The current positive balance in our checking account gives us the flexibility to deal with some infrastructure issues (such as painting, and replacing the back door to the pastor's office), and we expect some expenses from those projects that will draw down our checking account balance. The third account, labeled "special money", at Callaway Bank, still includes the \$2,653 remaining from the Bridgeton Fund grant that we received last year. That grant money will go toward paying for painting of the exterior woodwork of the church, a project that we hope will be accomplished in the next few weeks. I also want to remind people that we have an electronic mechanism for making pledges and donations (or other payments) to the church: on the church website (www.millersburgchristianchurch.org) is a "donate" button near the top of the home page. Clicking on that takes you to a secure PayPal page from which a donation to the church can be made either via a PayPal account or through the use of a credit/debit card. This was actually used during our recent rummage sale, and so we can verify that it does work! The convenience of using this technology may appeal to some of our members and friends.

I also want to remind committee chairs that budget askings for 2018 should be submitted to the Stewardship and Finance committee by the first of September.
