Rev. Dr. Larry Brown chosen to speak

This year's C.S. Lewis Legacy Lecture will focus on the legacy of martyred German pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Storyteller and former pastor of MCC, the Rev. Dr. Larry Brown will deliver Westminster College's eighth annual lecture at 11 a.m. February 6 in the Church of St. Mary the Virgin, Aldermanbury.

Brown is famous for infiltrating and writing about racist, white nationalist groups throughout the United States. He frequently appears on PBS. Bonhoeffer famously opposed Adolf Hitler and vehemently protested Nazi treatment of the Jews during World War II. Brown's lecture will commemorate the 75th anniversary of Bonhoeffer's death. He was executed April 9, 1945, at Flossenburg, a Nazi concentration camp in Flossenburg, Germany.

The C.S. Lewis Legacy Lecture is a well-established event at Westminster that honors the legacy of British writer and thinker C.S. Lewis. Through the annual lecture, the college seeks to bring to campus people who speak to themes, topics and issues Lewis regarded highly. Brown is an ordained Disciples of Christ minister and a professor emeritus of human geography at the University of Missouri-Columbia.

In case you didn't already know it – there are several people in our congregation heavily involved in global mission work. Jeff and Barbara Moran travel extensively with the Mobility Worldwide project and Danny Rose is a regular volunteer in the Columbia office. We all know about Brenda Rose's work with the Ryan's Case for Smiles pillowcase project but here is something that she participated in recently. Very proud to call all of these people my friend.

“Beginning in March 2018 local sewists began working with Dr. Bob Hansen, President of Humanity for Children to support the organization's effort to provide safe birthing kits for East African countries of Tanzania, Rwanda, Uganda, and Kenya. The receiving blankets make up one piece of the kit in an effort to dry newborns and wrap them to keep warm. Along with other components and training for birthing attendants this effort has lowered the infant mortality rate among villages. Many individuals and groups, such as the Fulton Presbyterian Church and Central Christian Church and individuals in Millersburg and Olivet Church have contributed time, fabric and labor to these blankets. Over two years there have been 5 "blanket blitz workshops" resulting in over 874 receiving blankets made, rolled and tied to make their way to Africa.

In October Israel Kioki, a Masai and HFC's only paid employee on the ground in Africa, visited the United States. He, along with Bob stopped by Brenda's home to say thanks for her efforts in coordinating some of the activities for making the blankets. It was a wonderful visit and great to meet the partners in making a difference in lives of babies.

The good news is the blanket makers have put themselves out of business. The Faultless Starch Company also provides linens to hospitals will begin providing the hospital receiving blankets, with the idea that more fabric will be obtained along with sewing machines. This effort will lead women to create a small business industry to make blankets, school uniforms, etc. in their own village to sustain their own needs. Brenda said this is such wonderful news and gives great satisfaction in the efforts given in love. Now we can move on to helping in other ways.
